## STEM Forward/ASCE April 2018 Luncheon

## The Estabrook Dam Removal Project and Why a Sewage District is Taking it On



ASCE and STEM Forward are pleased to welcome Tom Chapman, Project Manager at the Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewage District. Chapman will discuss the process of how Milwaukee's Estabrook Dam was originally planned for a repair, and ultimately ended as a dam removal project, and why MMSD was the agency that took the project on.

The objectives for the dam removal project are to reduce risk of flooding of homes within the Milwaukee River floodplain, improve aquatic habitat connectivity and water quality, and remove a long-term financial liability for the community.

Tom Chapman is a Project Manager for the Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewerage District (MMSD) and is responsible for flood management, stream restoration and green infrastructure projects. Prior to joining MMSD in 1999, Chapman spent 10 years in the private sector with various water resources consulting firms. He is a registered professional engineer in the State of Wisconsin and serves as president of the Forest Exploration Center Board.

July 2018 marks the conclusion of the 2016 - 2018 biennium for completing the necessary continuing education to maintain Professional Engineer licensure. As such, each licensed Professional Engineer must document the completion of at least 30 professional development hours (PDH) during the current biennium to meet license renewal requirements for the 2018-2020 biennium.

The Southeast Branch's monthly lunch meetings provide an excellent source of PDHs, and your annual ASCE membership entitles you to choose up to five ASCE On-Demand Webinars - **free of charge**, via the ASCE website. Those ASCE webinars provide another excellent way to earn a PDH for each one you complete and pass – and you get 5 free!
